1. Introduction

The UWW Anti-doping program is managed by the General Affairs Department (in collaboration with the Development Department with regards education and outreach) and the Medical & Anti-doping Commission.

The Anti-doping program consists of the following:

- Testing (in and out-of-competition)
- Results Management (positive cases, whereabouts failures)
- Therapeutic Use Exemptions
- Education & Outreach

2. Testing conducted by UWW in 2017

As Testing Authority, UWW and the 2017 event organizers have planned and carried out the following number of tests. This breakdown does not include the testing performed by National Anti-doping Organizations under their own program.

4. Therapeutic Use Exemptions

The UWW Therapeutic Use Exemption Committee (TUEC) is composed of three doctors from the Medical & Anti-doping Commission (Dr Marc Demars - FRA - chairman, Mika Lehto - FIN - Kohei Nakajima - JPN) and reviews all TUE applications of international level Wrestlers.

In 2017, the TUEC reviewed eight (8) Therapeutic Use Exemptions: five (5) were approved, two were recognized and one (1) was denied.

5. Education and outreach

Education and outreach is part of the anti-doping program and is essential to ensure Wrestlers and Coaches acquire knowledge about anti-doping rules as well as the dangers of doping.

In collaboration with the Development department as well as several National Anti-doping Organizations (NADOs), education and outreach activities were organized during championships (for example Asian Cadet 2017, World Junior 2017), More Than Medals camps and Coach courses (Level 1).

A series of seminars were held in Armenia (Yerevan, Gyumri) and in Georgia in October in collaboration with the National Anti-doping Organizations of Armenia and Georgia. This project was funded by UNESCO.

In 2017, 25 Wrestlers included in the UWW Registered Testing Pool were requested to complete WADA's Alpha e-learning program.

As part of UWW's policy of reduction of financial sanctions imposed for anti-doping rules violations, the National Wrestling Federation of Egypt held a seminar for 40 Coaches in 2017, which allowed the reduction of a previous fine imposed for doping to be reduced by half.

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
